

Time of Death Notes 4 common methods to establish time of death: 1. Rigor Mortis 2. Livor Mortis 3. Algor Mortis 4. Decomposition (including entomology)

Rigor Mortis:

The stiffening of skeletal muscles after death

- Caused by: Calcium build up in muscles. Heart can't pump it out anymore.
- When does it start: 2 hours after death
- When does it end: 36-48 hours
- Why does it end: The body starts to decay, breakdown, liquify




Livor Mortis:

The pooling of blood after death Resulting of reddish color of skin

• Caused by: Heart can't pump blood. Blood drains

due to gravity.
